He uses the “triple image” of Head, Heart and Hands. **Head** is about our belief in a loving God and that He is with us. **Heart** which is about love, love of God and of others. Finally **The Hands** which are about action, how we show our love in caring for each other and especially those in need. The Parish Faith mission is an opportunity to nourish these three ‘H’s’ Head, Heart and Hands—All three if we are to become more rounded Christians.

Mission Prayer: Mother of Perpetual Help, with the greatest confidence we come before your holy picture to be inspired by the example of your life. When you learned that your cousin Elizabeth was in need you immediately went to serve her and offer your help. Help us, like you, to be concerned for others. Mother of Sorrows, help us to realise that we must expect trials and disappointments. Help us not to lose heart. May we share with you and your Son the joy of having courageously faced up to all the challenges of life. Amen

Today’s Gospel: The teachings in this passage are radical and go against what we hear around us in our world like calls for retribution and revenge. However Jesus has high expectations of his followers, to go against the grain. Jesus is not encouraging passiveness. He is inviting people to a ‘third way’: to make a non-violent stand when faced with persecution. By ‘offering the other cheek’ we allow for the potential of conversion of the other to a realisation of what they have done. The easy option is to retaliate, to not see our brother or sister standing before us. We can offer them an opportunity to see our own sacred humanity. ‘Loving our enemies’ is a call to constantly move towards restoring relationships, offering mercy and peace. ‘An eye for an eye will leave the world blind’.
