Parish Mission in honour of Our Lady of Perpetual Help on **Monday 13th, 20th, 27th February and Monday 6th March, 8-9pm in Rathmolyon Church.**

Theme: Faith nourished, celebrated and lived.



Fr. Declan Hurley, P.P. Navan will commence our Faith Mission on Monday 13th February with a talk on ‘What difference does Faith Make?’ Fr. Peter McVerry and Mrs. Jessie Rogers will deliver the talks on the 20th and 27th while Bishop Michael Smith will close the Mission on 6th March with a Mass. The Mission Service each evening will take place in Rathmolyon church. Each night people will have the opportunity to offer their own written petitions on a prayer card which will be delivered to each household with the mission brochure. Petition cards can be returned to either church with petitions offered for any intention that people wish to pray for during the 4 weeks of the Mission. There will also be an opportunity for people to light a candle at the shrine of Our Lady of Perpetual Help which will be set up in both churches.

Mission Prayer to Our Lady of Perpetual Help: Mother of Perpetual Help, with the greatest confidence we come before your holy picture to be inspired by the example of your life. We think of you at that moment when, full of faith and trust, you accepted God’s call to be the mother of his Son. Help us, your children, to accept with joy our own calling in life. When you learned that your cousin Elizabeth was in need you immediately went to serve her and offer your help. Help us, like you, to be concerned for others. We think of you, Mother, at the foot of the cross. Your heart must have bled to see your Son in agony. But your joy was great when he rose from the dead, victorious over the powers of evil. Mother of Sorrows, help us through the trials and disappointments of life. Help us not to lose heart. May we share with you and your Son the joy of having courageously faced up to all the challenges of life. Amen.

Todays Gospel: The choice is ours ‘An old Cherokee is teaching his grandson about life. “A battle is going on inside all of us,” he said to the boy. “It is a terrible fight and it is between two wolves. One is evil – anger, envy, sorrow, regret, greed, arrogance, self-pity, guilt, resentment, inferiority, lies, false pride, superiority, and ego. The other is good – joy, peace, love, hope, humility, kindness, benevolence, empathy, generosity, truth, compassion, and faith. This same fight is going on inside you – and inside every other person, too.” The grandson thought about it for a minute and then asked his grandfather, “Which wolf will win?” The old Cherokee simply replied, “The one you feed”.’ In a way, it is as simple as that. Each one of us faces hundreds of choices every day. Mostly, they are minor decisions that may not seem important at the time. But they all add up to something. They make us the person we are. Do our choices make us the kind of person who follows Jesus, or the kind of person who goes in the opposite direction? We can stay stuck where we are, repeating the same old patterns, or we can leave it all behind and choose a new path, like Peter, Andrew, James and John did. They were called, and they took decisive action. This initial choice to follow Jesus was reinforced and remade, day in and day out, during their discipleship journey, just as it is on ours
