(The Letter of St. Paul to Titus 1:1-8) That's what God invited us all to do when he laid his hands on us on the day of our Baptism—to fan the gift of faith, received through Baptism into a "flame" burning brightly in our lives. The aim of our Parish Mission is to help us understand, celebrate, nourish and live out our faith more fully. The prayer of our mission is that of the person in the Gospel of St. Mark.
