Sacred Hart Novena: June 4th - June 12th

Novena Prayer: O Divine Jesus who said "Ask and you shall receive, seek and you shall find, knock and the door shall be opened to you. I kneel at Your feet. From whom shall I ask if not from You, whose Heart is the source of all blessings. O Divine Jesus, your Heart was moved by compassion for the men and women who came to You in need. You healed the sick, You forgave sinners, You are the way, the truth and the Life. O Divine Jesus your heart is still full of compassion for us today in our many needs. Assured of Your love we turn to You and ask...(pause, here mention your request). I admit I am most unworthy of Your favour, Jesus, but this is not a reason for me to be discouraged. You are the God of mercies and You will not refuse a contrite Heart. Look with pity on me, I beg You so that Your compassionate Heart will find in my weakness a motive for granting my request. May the Sacred Heart of Jesus be everywhere loved. Our Lady of the Sacred Heart pray for us.

Today's Gospel - Feast of Holy Trinity: At World Youth Day in Rome in 2000, I heard for my first time, from the mouth of Pope Saint John Paul II, St Catherine of Siena's famous quote 'If you are what you should be, you will set the whole world ablaze.' We know that God has made us in his own image and likeness. We should really be the image of God that he has made us to be. So we should be like God in the way we live our relationships. We should be people of communion. Communion firstly with God, through prayer and relationship with him, and springing from that, a relationship of Christ-like love towards all the people in our lives. At the beginning of the new millennium, Pope Saint John Paul asked the whole Church to promote a spirituality of communion, for us to meditate on the Trinity living in us, so that each of us can see God's other people as 'those who are a part of me'. It involves seeing what is positive in others as a gift for me also. He says it also means resisting selfish temptations that provoke competition, careerism, distrust and jealousy. This is a way of life Jesus wants us to spread. 'Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit...' What wonderful news to bring to all nations: that love is at the heart of the central mystery of Christian faith and life, the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity!
