**Today's Gospel:** The people we honour as saints today were by no means saints from the day of their birth. They were human like all of us, but they practiced the Beatitudes, and made them come alive as an example for all of us to follow. People come and go in our lives, often poor, hungry, those who are persecuted. These are the people, the saints possibly, that God sends our way as reminders of how we should be. After all, the Beatitudes, are about 'being'. Our 'Be' - 'Attitudes'. The saints are people who let the light of God shine through them to reveal something more in life and to give hope. A man had a dream and God said to him, 'Build a better world'. And I asked how? The world is such a vast place and so complicated now, I am small and useless. What can I do? God in all his wisdom said, 'Just build a better you'.

**Saints:** Saints make our hypocrisy so apparent that we want to change our lives—not because of guilt but because we want to be alive, we want to be more like Jesus... (they) leave us the scent of God, the aroma of Christ. In God's flirting with humanity. God occasionally drops a handkerchief—and these handkerchiefs are called saints.
