Remembering our departed during the month of November:

Everybody loves to be remembered, but if we want to be remembered, we have a duty also to remember. Memory is a powerful thing. Wrongly used it can bring death rather than life. Rightly used it is a form of immortality. It keeps the past alive. Those we remember never die. They continue to walk with and talk with us. Their influence is still felt among us. There is nothing stronger or more helpful than a good remembrance. Mother/Father, we want you to know that we haven't forgotten you. We remember you, and your memory most definitely brings life to us today. May it also assure us of life for you, that eternal life Christ came to earth to give to us. Amen.

Today's Gospel: *Bartimaeus* - We too are blind in many ways. We too are poor before God. Jesus calls us to come to him. He wants to make us well. However, we find it hard to throw the 'cloak' away, and come to him just as we are. Pride makes us try to put on an outward show. We may believe that we have to be perfect, otherwise he won't love us. To admit our sins and weaknesses would cause him to reject us. But if we were perfect, if we were well, we wouldn't need him at all. Many people sit at the roadside of life begging, not for money but for love, for attention, for a feeling that they are important and that life has a meaning. Many of them are too embarrassed to ask for help. They are afraid of being silenced by the indifference of others. Lord that we may see – see our needy brothers and sisters, that we may hear their silent cries, that we may not pass by. For we too were beggars, and you enriched me. We too were blind, and you enlightened us
