Day For Life: Last year, Pope Francis published his important encyclical on the relationship between God's holy people and creation – *Laudato si'*. The Pope reminded us powerfully that we are one human family sharing a common home, dependent upon one another and the whole of creation. It is our duty to "pay special attention to the most vulnerable." He said, "Neglecting to monitor the harm done to nature and the environmental impact of our decisions is only the most striking sign of a disregard for the message contained in the structures of nature itself. When we fail to acknowledge as part of reality the worth of a poor person, a human embryo, a person with disabilities – to offer just a few examples – it becomes difficult to hear the cry of nature itself; everything is connected." Pope Francis, *Laudato si'* 117 When we recognise and grow in wonder that we are all brothers and sisters living in one common home, it will not only affect how we care for the environment, but more importantly how we care for one another, how we welcome and accept those with different needs and abilities, refugees, the elderly, the unborn, the forgotten and the abandoned. Growing in wonder will help us to treasure more deeply the gift of human life. **Prayer:** All powerful God, you are present in the whole universe and in the smallest of your creatures. You embrace with your tenderness all that exists. Pour out upon us the power of your love, That we may protect life and beauty.
