Today's Gospel: You and I are part of the Gospel story today. We are the five brothers of the rich man who, through this Gospel passage, has himself come to us from the dead, to remind us of the lesson he learned too late. The following is inscribed on the tomb of an Anglican Bishop in Westminster Abbey: 'When I was young and free and my imagination had no limits, I dreamed of changing the world. As I grew older and wiser, I discovered the world would not change, so I shortened my sights somewhat and decided to change only my country. But it seemed too immovable. As I grew into my twilight years, in one last desperate attempt, I settled for changing only my family, those closest to me, but alas they would have none of it. And now, as I lie on my deathbed, I suddenly realise, if I only changed myself first, then by example I would have changed my family. From their inspiration and encouragement, I would then have been able to better my country and who knows, I may have even changed the world'
